WORKSHOPS

Each workshop includes components such as an introduction to the topic, group work based on selected materials, a presentation, and a concluding discussion. The workshops are designed for youth aged 14 and over.

WORK METHODS

Each workshop is based on active work that uses witness accounts, photographs or documents supplemented by primary sources. The aim of the workshops is to reflect in depth on various aspects of the camp reality, the human being amid this reality, and the individual dimension of the tragedy of Auschwitz, made up of the prisoners' emotions and internal dilemmas.

"I am convinced of the significance of such education: substantive, factual, covering all that is important, and, last but not least, allowing time for emotions," a history teacher said.
